ORDER 12.08.2009

The only defence and objection raised before Central Information Commission was under Section 8(1)(j) of the Right to Information Act, 2005. No other provision/sub-clause of Section 8(1) of the aforesaid Act was relied upon by the petitioner before the Central Information Commission. In these circumstances, I do not think the petitioner is entitled to rely upon Sections 8(1)(e) or (i) of the Right to Information Act, 2005. The petitioner did not rely upon the Sub-sections (e) and (i) of Section 8(1) before the Central Information Commission. In a writ petition, while exercising power of judicial review the court is concerned with the decision

making process and a writ court is not an appellate forum where for the first time section 8 (1) (e) and (i) of the said Act can be relied upon.

The petition does not question the decision of the Central Information Commission rejecting objection relying upon section 8 (1) (j) of the said Act. In these circumstances, the contentions raised in the present Writ Petition relying upon section 8 (1) (e) and (i) do not merit consideration and the same is dismissed.
